Attached is my recommendation for appointments to the Historic Preservation Board and the Museum & Cultural Advisory Board.

**Historic Preservation Board** – Seven-member board with one new appointment.

Jeri Meeks, District 4. Ms. Meeks currently serves as the Operations Manager for the Mesa Historical Museum. Pervisoulsy, Ms. Meeks spent a thirty year career with Arizona State University in business operations and human resources management. Ms. Meeks volunteers her time with the Mesa United Way, East Valley Museum Colaition, Mesa Hearsts Studio, and many additional organizations. Ms. Meeks currently resides in the Wilbur Historic District. She holds degrees in anthropology and liberal studies from Arizona State University. Ms Meeks' appointment will be filling a vacancy created by the resignation of Annalisa Alvrus. Ms. Meeks' partial term will expire June 30, 2018.

**Museum & Cultural Advisory Board** – Eleven-member board with one new appointment.

Alycia Perry, District 4. Ms. Perry is a self employed brand marketing consultant and writer with over twenty years experience in that field. She is also an adjunct professor of Marketing and Entrepreneurship at Benedictine University and an adjunct professor of Communications for the ASU School of Sustainability Masters of Leadership Program. Previous roles include executive director of the Sonoran Desert Chorale and Executive Director of the Symphony of the Southwest. Ms. Perry holds a bachelor of arts in Political Science. Ms. Perry's appointment will be filling a vacancy created by the resignation of Robert Valverde. Her partial term will expire June 30, 2020.
