City Manager Christopher Brady provided a summary regarding Item 1, (Conduct a public hearing on the proposed Fiscal Year 2022-23 Budget and the proposed Fiscal Year 2022-23 Secondary Property Tax Levy, and take action on the Fiscal Year 2022-23 Budget.), on the Special Council meeting agenda, and pointed out budget items for fiscal year (FY) 2022/2023 include:

- Additional officers and firefighters and scheduling more academies to keep up with retirements and attrition.
- Additional staff positions for the Domestic Violence Court.
- Proposal to double funding for street maintenance to allocate more resources.
- \$10 million for Climate Action Plan implementation.
- Transit pilot program; adding bus shelters throughout the system.
- Addition of a special events office.

- 4% step pay increase for eligible employees.
- \$2,000 one-time payment to employees.

- \$500 incentive based on attendance for sworn personnel.
- Pipelines bringing re-use water to Gila community.

In response to a request from Councilmember Freeman asking for clarification on the reduced tax levy, Mr. Brady explained the City has been conservative in its collection estimates, while acknowledging that projects and schedules were delayed. He noted the City has built a reserve, which is why the tax rate can be reduced and still meet the City's debts and obligations.
