### 2-a. Hear a presentation, continue discussions, and provide funding recommendations for the FY 2018/19 and prior years' available funding for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), and Human Services Programs.

Community Services Director Ruth Giese introduced Community Revitalization Coordinator Dennis Newburn and stated that staff had reviewed the recommendations from the March 1, 2018 Committee meeting. She reported that contingency funding and reallocating Downtown Façade Improvements Program funding have been combined to award approximately \$440,570 to the Child Crisis Arizona campus expansion.

It was moved by Committeemember Luna, seconded by Committeemember Thompson, to recommend to the Council the funding recommendations for the FY 2018-19 and prior years' available funding for Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), HOME Investment Partnerships (HOME), Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), and Human Services Programs as recommended by staff.
