II. Approval of Minutes

Motion to approve the HCDAB minutes – Linda Starr made a motion to approve the minutes from the August 7, 2014 HCDAB meeting. The motion was seconded by Diana Yazzie Devine and carried by a vote of 6-0.

Citizens present that submitted speaker/comment cards included: Desiree Mueller, a Mesa resident, general concerns and inquiries regarding resources available to help homeless people; Ryan Winkle, a Mesa resident, for Agenda Items IV(A)1 and 2.

Desiree Mueller, a Mesa resident, asked about additional resources available to homeless, disabled, elderly persons, in addition to IHELP for sleeping arrangements. Tammy Albright, Housing and Community Development Director, and Linda Starr, HCDAB Member, provided Ms. Mueller additional information regarding the resources available throughout the community that some of the non-profit agencies offer. Tammy Albright also provided Ms. Mueller her contact information and asked Ms. Mueller to come in to the Housing and Community Development office to meet with her and she would provide her with additional assistance to help her in contacting the appropriate agencies that would be able to assist Ms. Mueller.

Public comments:

Ryan Winkle, a Mesa resident and representative of non-profit agency, NEDCO, fully supports the Amendment and said that this will be good for downtown Mesa and will bring more opportunities for professionals, as well as, the citizens and Subrecipients of HUD funding.
