Consent Agenda

The following items will be considered as a group by the Transportation Advisory Board and will be voted on with one motion. There will be no separate discussion of these items unless a Board Member or citizen requests, in which event the item will be removed from the Consent Agenda and considered as a separate item.

- a. [Discuss and take action on staff recommendation to establish a speed limit of 40 mph on Williams Field Road from the west City limits to Innovation Way.](#) (Williams Field Road east of Power Road, Council District 6)
- b. [Discuss and take action on staff recommendation to establish a speed limit of 35 mph on Point Twenty-Two Boulevard from Ellsworth Road to Signal Butte Road and on Eastmark Parkway from the north City limits to the south City limits.](#) (Eastmark Development near Ellsworth and Ray Roads, Council District 6)

Informational Update on Recent Council Action:

At its December 2, 2013 meeting, the City Council acknowledged the receipt of the minutes of the August 20, 2013 Transportation Advisory Board meeting. The City Council also approved the renaming of 3rd Place to Martin Luther King, Jr. Way from North Center Street to North Centennial Way.

Informational Update on Recent Parking Prohibitions:

Approved on September 30, 2013 – to maintain clear travel lanes and ensure proper traffic signal operation.

- On Serrine from University Drive to a point 87 feet north of University Drive. (West of Mesa Drive and north of University Drive, Council District 4)

Approved on October 3, 2013 – insufficient roadway width to accommodate travel lanes and on street parking.

- On Hermosa Vista Drive from Hawes Road to a point 2025 feet east of Hawes Road. (East of Hawes Road and north of McKellips Road, Council District 5)

Approved on November 13, 2013 – remove existing parking prohibition to accommodate parking in a former bus pullout at the request of the adjacent school. Parking is now allowed:

- On the west side of Solomon from a point 80 feet north of Broadway Road to 3rd Avenue. (West of Stapley Drive and north of Broadway Road, Council District 4)
