

A. Massage Establishment


1. Details of the premises must be submitted with the licensing application; after the licensing application has been approved no changes may be made to the premises without notice to the City.
2. Business hours restrictions.
3. The City must be notified of any change in information provided upon tax and licensing application.
4. Schedule of services must be provided to the City and the City must be notified of any change in the services provided before the changes take effect.
5. Require that an applicant provide a sworn affidavit to the City that no person not qualified to own, control or manage a massage establishment is involved in ownership or management if the location of the establishment under application was previously a massage establishment that had its license suspended, denied, or revoked within the preceding six (6) month period.
6. Advance approval of any change in location.
7. Include approximately thirty (30) requirements a massage establishment must meet in order to obtain a license or to maintain a license, such as readable signs, clean wash basins, clean sheets, clean towels, all walls, ceilings, floors and fans must be in good repair, all equipment disinfected, etc.
8. The businesses:
 - a. Provide the name, license number and photograph of each massage therapist
 - b. Identify in advance the manager and the temporary manager.
 - c. Submit the name and photograph of the all of the employees of the massage establishment.
 - d. File a floor plan indicating room numbers.
 - e. Maintain a log that, at a minimum, identifies the massage therapists daily work activity.

B. Massage Establishment Employees

1. Each massage therapist licensed through the State must maintain a current license, operate under the name listed on the license and operate consistent with the mandates of the State Massage Licensing Code and the Mesa City Code.
2. Each manager must submit an application as well as a current photograph with the licensing application.
3. Each manager must obtain a manager permit that must be renewed yearly.
4. Unlawful to employ any person to act as a manager who is not licensed by the City.
5. Photographs of all employees must be maintained on the premises.
