February 20, 2014

The City Council of the City of Mesa met in a Study Session in the lower level meeting room of the Council Chambers, 57 East 1st Street, on February 20, 2014 at 7:30 a.m.

1. Review items on the agenda for the February 24, 2014 Regular Council meeting.

All of the items on the agenda were reviewed among Council and staff and the following was noted:

 Hear a presentation, discuss and provide direction regarding amendments to the FY 2011-12, 2012-13 and 2013-14 Annual Action Plans (HOME Program) and for designation of prior year unallocated HOME funds and program income.

Director of Housing and Community Development Tammy Albright displayed a PowerPoint presentation (See Attachment 1) indicating three potential amendments to the Fiscal Years 2011-12, 2012-13 and 2013-14 Annual Action Plans (HOME Program). She explained that due to the closing of the agency that provided services to the HOME Program, there is a total of \$442,559 unallocated.

Ms. Albright outlined a proposal to change the HOME Program approval process from the Housing and Community Development Advisory Board (HCDAB) back to the City Council. She stated that staff received over \$1.4 million in requests to participate in the Low Income Tax Credit projects from the Arizona Department of Housing. She illustrated a chart (See Page 5 and 6 of Attachment 1) outlining prior year funds available to be converted to rental funds and a timeline that included a 30-day public comment period.

In response to a question from Councilmember Richins related to promoting homeownership, Ms. Albright indicated that staff has compiled several documents outlining the homeownership program and added that staff will be issuing a Request for Proposal (RFP) this summer for the purpose of partnering with local and regional agencies to help build the necessary capacity to promote homeownership. She stated that the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) will be initiating a training seminar to interested organizations and individuals on Community Housing Development Organization status to promote the homeownership program.

Councilmember Kavanaugh thanked Ms. Albright for the recommendations and added that he is glad to see an interest and participation from the applicants. He commented that State deadlines are often difficult for applicable cities to meet certain requirements and asked how the City plans to communicate with interested applicants, both today and later in the program, in order to meet State requirements.

Ms. Albright confirmed that a letter was submitted to the State outlining the process and program timeline and added that the details of the project will be presented to the Council at a later date. She stressed that one of the difficulties is not being able to provide the requested funding to the applicants due to the low tax credit; and that many are seeking Qualified Allocation Plan (QAP) financing. She advised that HUD requires a subsidy layering review to determine the finance amount and stated the importance of complying with those requirements.

It was moved by Councilmember Kavanaugh, seconded by Councilmember Richins, that the recommendations be approved.

Mayor Smith declared the motion carried unanimously by those present.
