

RESOLUTION NO. 10104

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESA, MARICOPA COUNTY, ARIZONA, DESIGNATING THE GENERAL ELECTION DATE AND THE PURPOSE OF THE GENERAL ELECTION; DESIGNATING THE DEADLINE FOR FILING ARGUMENTS FOR AND AGAINST BALLOT MEASURES; DESIGNATING THE DEADLINE FOR VOTER REGISTRATION; AND ESTABLISHING THE TIMES THAT POLLS WILL BE OPEN.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 10017, the City of Mesa called a Primary Election for August 28, 2012 to nominate candidates for Mayor and Councilmember in Districts 1, 2 and 3; and

WHEREAS, the City Council believes several issues of importance in the operation of the City of Mesa should be submitted to the voters for their approval.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Mesa, as follows:

Section 1. That November 6, 2012 has been set as the time for holding the General Election in the City of Mesa.

At the General Election, the qualified electors of the City shall vote on the following measures:

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| Question 1 | Parks, Open Space, Recreational and Aquatic Facility Bonds
(The estimated average tax rate for the proposed bond authorization is \$0.20 per \$100 of secondary assessed valuation.) |
| Proposition 460 | Amending the Mesa City Charter Article II, Section 203 entitled "Mayor and Vice Mayor" |
| Proposition 461 | Amending the Mesa City Charter Article VI, Section 605 entitled "Capital Program" |
| Proposition 462 | Amending the Mesa City Charter Article VII, Section 701 entitled "City Elections" |
| Proposition 463 | Amending the Mesa City Charter Article II, Section 201 C and D entitled "Term of Councilmember" and "Term of Mayor" |
| Proposition 464 | Amending the Mesa City Charter Article II, Section 201 F entitled "Elections" |

At the General Election, the qualified electors of the City may also be asked to vote on any other propositions or questions that legally qualify for the ballot.

Section 2. **NOTARIZED** arguments advocating or opposing ballot measures shall be filed with the Mesa City Clerk's Office, 20 East Main Street, Suite 150, not later than 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, August 8, 2012.

Section 3. In order to be qualified to vote, citizens must be registered by October 9, 2012 for the General Election. Maricopa County registration and voting lists will be used for the municipal elections.

Section 4. Polling places shall open at 6:00 a.m. and close at 7:00 p.m. on Election Day.
