

RESOLUTION NO. 9735

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MESA, ARIZONA, DESIGNATING THE GENERAL ELECTION DATE AND THE PURPOSE OF THE GENERAL ELECTION; DESIGNATING THE DEADLINE FOR FILING ARGUMENTS FOR AND AGAINST BALLOT MEASURES; DESIGNATING THE DEADLINE FOR VOTER REGISTRATION; AND ESTABLISHING THE TIMES THAT POLLS WILL BE OPEN.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 9657, the City of Mesa called a Primary Election for August 24, 2010 to nominate candidates in Districts 4, 5 and 6; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 201 (F) of the Mesa City Charter, a General Election shall be held if no candidate receives a majority of all valid ballots cast during the Primary Election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Mesa, as follows:

Section 1. That November 2, 2010 has been set as the time for holding the General Election in the City of Mesa for the purpose of electing Councilmembers in Council Districts 4, 5 and 6, whose terms shall expire in January 2015, where no candidate was elected at the Primary Election.

At the General Election, the qualified electors of the City shall also vote on the following measures:

Question 1	Alternative Expenditure Limitation (Home Rule)
Proposition 420	Relating to economic incentives as required by Section 613 of the Mesa City Charter
Question 2	Transient Lodging Tax ("Bed Tax")
Question 3	Gas System Revenue Bonds
Question 4	Water System Revenue Bonds
Question 5	Wastewater System Revenue Bonds
Question 6	Electric System Revenue Bonds
Question 7	Southwest Gas Franchise

At the General Election, the qualified electors of the City may also be asked to vote on any propositions or questions that legally qualify for the ballot.

Section 2. **NOTARIZED** arguments advocating or opposing ballot measures shall be filed with the Mesa City Clerk's Office, 20 East Main Street, Suite 150, not later than 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, August 4, 2010.

Section 3. In order to be qualified to vote, citizens must be registered by October 4, 2010 for the General Election. Maricopa County registration and voting lists will be used for the municipal elections.

Section 4. Polling places shall open at 6:00 a.m. and close at 7:00 p.m. on Election Day.
