




Who is visiting ImagineMesa.com?




There is a fantastic, paved multi-use trail that runs parallel to Brown road and connects Mesa to Tempe via the new Stadium connector paths. These paths are amazing! You could extend this system by paving the Canal trail heading North from Brown and Horne. The shoulder of this canal is wide enough and would allow for paved, multi-use trail to take you from North East Mesa all the way to Sky Harbor as this would connect perfectly into your existing system. Since the ROW and grading is already complete, this would be a cost effective way to allow North and East Mesa access to the existing

Without this connection, residents north of brown and east of Higley don't have a way to get south and west on a multi-use trail.



What Happens Next?

All ideas received will be reviewed by a Council-appointed Imagine Mesa Advisory Committee of community members who will evaluate and prioritize ideas, and make recommendations to the City Council for potential implementation.
