Dear Mr. Shaw,

The City of Casa Grande Fire Department is requesting authorization to engage in an interoperability agreement with the TRWC Network. As you know, our department is a mutual aid partner with the Apache Junction and Florence Fire Department as part of the established agreement with the Pinal County Fire Chiefs Association. As part of that agreement, communications between agencies is essential. In addition to our mutual aid partnership with these departments, the Casa Grande Fire department is a participant in the East Valley Hazardous Materials cooperative along with Mesa, Scottsdale, Tempe and Chandler. Not only does our organization train with these partners, moreover, they/we can be called to assist. For both of these reasons, we seek approval to become an interoperability partner.

Currently, the department has (9) 800 MHz mobile radios that have been programmed to the RWC Network. We are adding an additional Ladder within the next year that will add one more mobile. In addition, it is our intention to purchase portable radios as funding allows.

Our department uses Creative Communications who services and programs radios for the department. New radios would be purchased and are typically programmed through them. If you have further questions, Battalion Chief Kevin Madden coordinates all portable and mobile radio systems for the department and is our point of contact. Subject: Administrator Update

Capital Projects

No capital projects were budgeted for FY13/14.

Operations Summary

System Availability – Please see the system availability chart at the bottom on this report. Since the last Administrator update on July, 2013, the availability has fallen below the goal of 99.999% availability twice. On July 25, 2013, at 12:30 PM, while troubleshooting a problem with the connectivity to the recently moved Shaw Butte site, the site was isolated from the system, causing it to go into site trunking for 4 minutes. On September 16, 2013, while installing the release A7.11 System Enhancement Release (SER), a Motorola technician inadvertently rebooted the active zone controller, putting the entire TOPAZ network into site trunking for 15 minutes. The major effect on users of this event was that the dispatch centers (Apache Junction Police, Gilbert Police, Mesa Fire, Mesa Police, and Mesa Utilities) had to switch to backup control stations to communicate with their units in the field.

Peak Channel Usage – Since the upgrade of the TRWC network to software release 7.11 in May, 2012, data on peak channel usage has been unavailable due to a software defect. It is unknown if this data will be recoverable. There have been no reports of busies from users during the period of July, 2013, through September, 2013. The software defect inhibiting the data for the reports was reportedly fixed in the SER installed September 16–19, 2013; please see item no. 2 below.

Other Significant Events - three significant events, as follows:

- 1) The TRWC radio site on the White Tanks mountains was moved to a new radio site on Shaw Butte on July 23, 2013. This was done to improve radio coverage on the west side of Phoenix. The coverage testing for Shaw Butte indicates that should provide much-improved radio coverage on the west side of Phoenix and the west valley. There has been no feedback from users (primarily law enforcement) regarding the coverage on the west side since the site was moved.
- 2) As reported above, the A7.11 SER was installed September 16–19, 2013. This SER was installed to fix a number of software defects. Unfortunately, two of the

- reports that were incorrectly formatted but provided useable data are not functioning at all. In addition, none of the historical reports appear to be gathering data since the SER was installed on September 17, 2013. Cases have been opened and escalated with Motorola. Testing is underway to determine if the remaining software defects have been fixed.
- 3) The City of Mesa Engineering/Real Estate department contacted the Communications Department on August 8, 2013, regarding a new power line to be installed by Salt River Project near the TRW site, located on Meridian Road between Pecos and Germann Roads. This new line will provide power to a plant being constructed by Matheson Tri-Gas at Pecos and Meridian Roads to supply Oxygen to the nearby CMC Steel mini-mill. This new power line, which will operate at 69 kilovolts, will physically obstruct the microwave radio paths from the TRW site to the TOPAZ radio sites located at Apache Junction fire stations 262 and 264. Work is underway to raise the height to the microwave dishes at TRW above the power line obstruction. There will be no cost to the TRWC members other than the City of Mesa for this work. In addition to raising the microwave dish at the TRW site, this work will enable the accelerated replacement of the microwave radios on the TRW to Apache Junction Fire station 264 path. This will also allow the existing microwave radio for this path to be utilized as a source of replacement parts. This accelerated replacement will result in an expense to the TRWC operating budget of less than \$20,000, in the November or December, 2013, billings.

Personnel – nothing to report.
