

- Mental health, services for children, homelessness supports

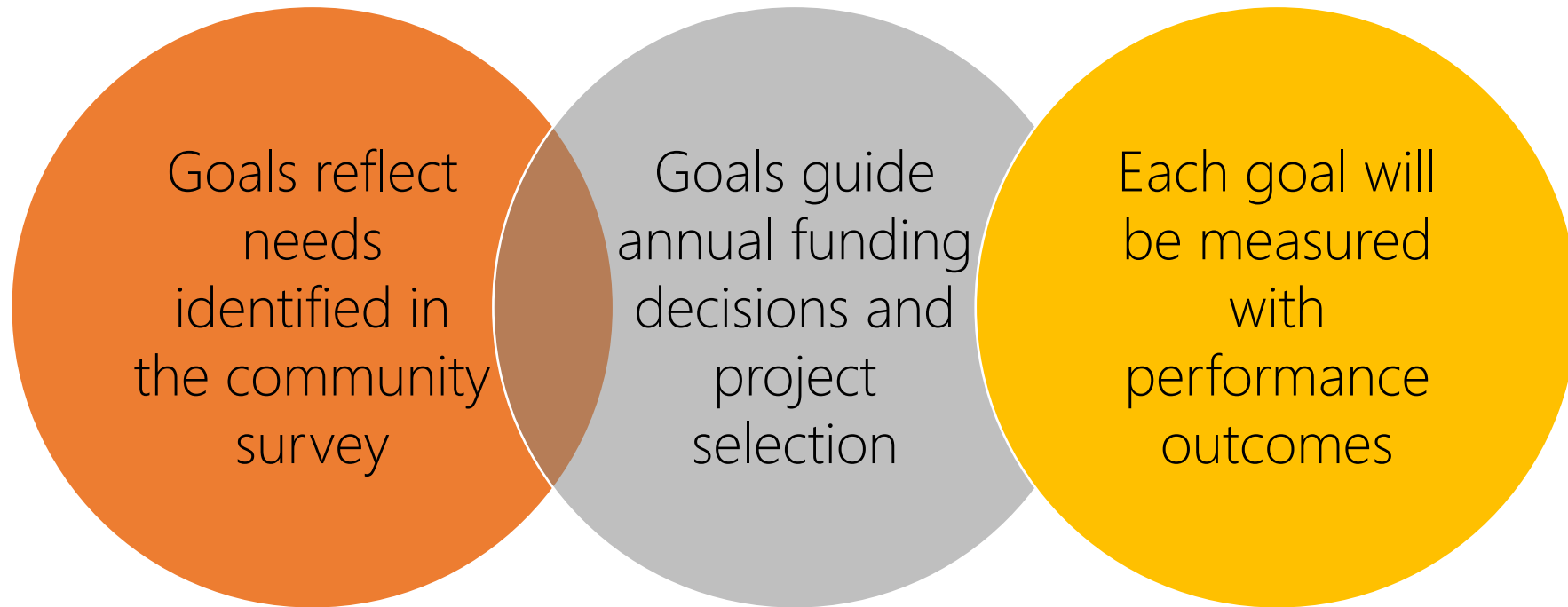
## Economic Development

Rising rents and poverty drive the need for affordable housing and services





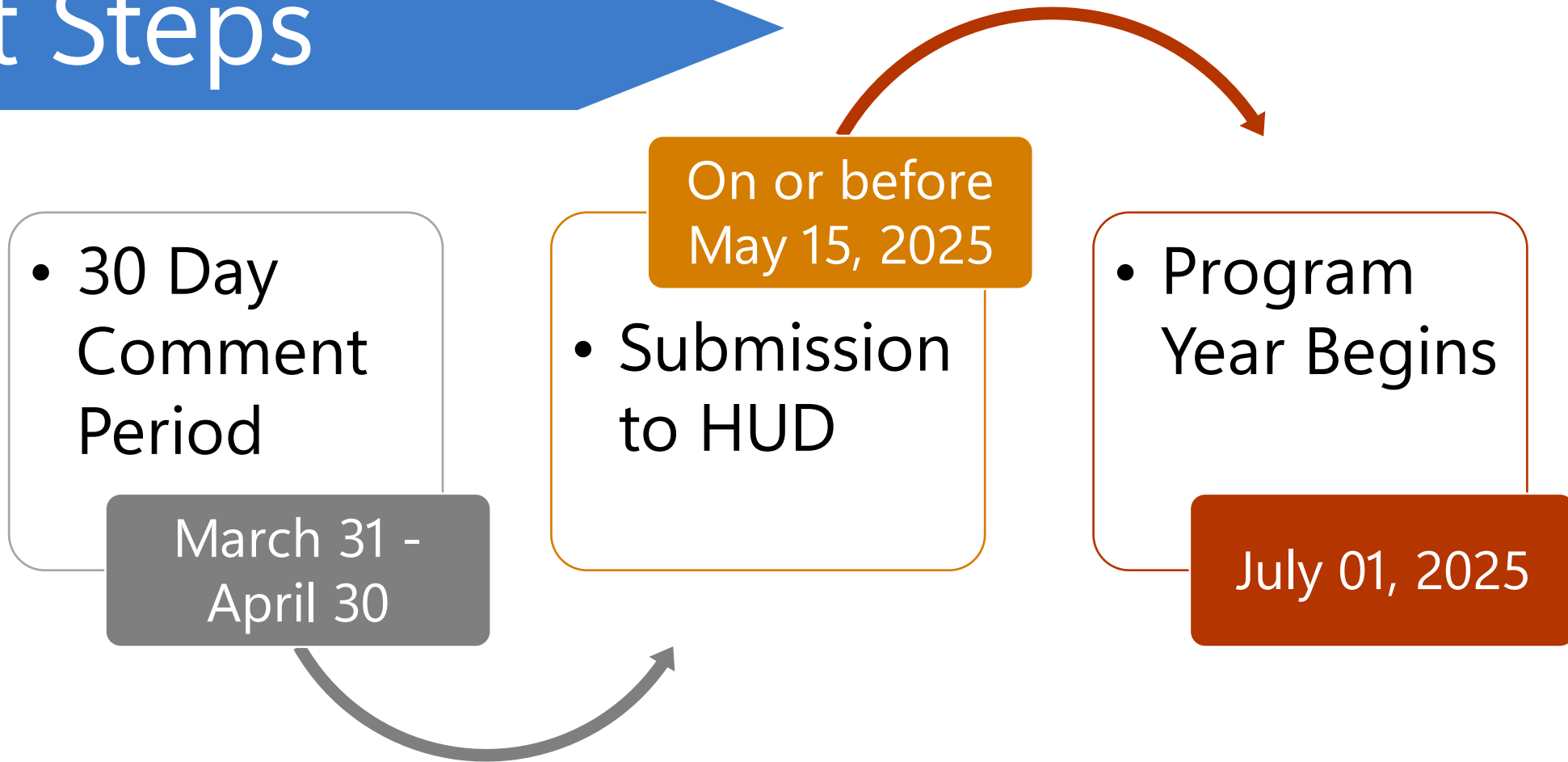
