

#### COUNCIL REDISTRICTING COMMISSION PUBLIC OUTREACH MEETING

August 12, 2021

The Council Redistricting Commission Public Outreach Meeting of the City of Mesa met at the Webster Recreation Center, 202 N. Sycamore, Mesa, Arizona on August 12, 2021, at 6:10 p.m.

#### 1. Welcome announcements.

Chairperson Deanna Villanueva-Saucedo welcomed everyone to the meeting and recognized District 3 Councilmember Heredia. She explained the purpose of redistricting and introduced commission members.

Chairperson Deanna Villanueva-Saucedo explained that the City is working with an accelerated timeline to obtain feedback and identify "Communities of Interest." She added that even though the census data is available, there is still some work to be done to make the data usable.

She briefly outlined the parameters for determining district boundaries as follows:

- Explained community mapping activity placemats
- Charter requirements of incumbent districts and redistricting guidelines
- Hear a presentation on redistricting principles, communities of interest, and redistricting mapping tools.

Sophia Garcia, Redistricting Partners GIS & Outreach Director, introduced Kimi Shigetani, Chief Administrative Officer with Redistricting Partners. Ms. Garcia presented the 2021 Redistricting Community Outreach presentation. (See Attachment 1)

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Ms. Garcia highlighted the redistricting process and noted that district lines are adjusted every 10 years after the release of the U.S. decennial census to ensure City Council districts are rebalanced. She added that beyond creating districts of equal population, redistricting also serves to empower local communities and maintain communities of interest.

Ms. Garcia briefly outlined some of the proposed topics to be covered as follows:

- Redistricting Basics
- Redistricting Commission
- Traditional Redistricting Principles
- Communities of Interest
- Map Tool Demonstration
- Public Testimony on Communities of Interest
- Public Hearing Schedule and Timeline

Ms. Garcia highlighted the traditional redistricting principles that prevent gerrymandering, which includes:

- Relatively equal size by population
- Contiguous districts should not hop/jump
- Maintain "communities of interest"
- Follow city/county/local government lines
- Keep districts compact in appearance and function

Ms. Garcia highlighted communities of interest, which are the building blocks of districts and is high-ranking criteria that brings people together for representation. She noted that communities of interest include ethnic and language minorities and other groups covered by the Voting Rights Act. She said that while race is a community of interest, it cannot be the predominant factor in drawing district boundaries and highlighted examples of communities of interest. Ms. Garcia invited citizens to draw their own maps, available at each table or by using the online mapping tool, which will be analyzed later by Redistricting Partners.

Chairperson Villanueva-Saucedo thanked Ms. Garcia for the presentation.

#### 3. Receive public comment, questions, and answers with the public.

Chairperson Villanueva-Saucedo responded to questions and comments from the public regarding drawing lines in relation to high school boundaries, communities of interest, mid-point census data, and previous redistricting highlights.

Chairperson Villanueva-Saucedo thanked the citizens for their participation and encouraged them leave feedback and utilizing the online mapping tools.


