Mayor Freeman conducted a roll call.

### 1. Review and discuss items on the agenda for the May 12, 2025, Regular Council meeting.

In response to multiple questions from Councilmember Spilsbury regarding Item 4-b, **(Val Vista Drive Improvements and Val Vista Sewer Rehabilitation Projects, Design-Bid-Build Contract (District 2))**, on the Regular Council meeting agenda, City Engineer Beth Huning provided an overview of the scope of the work and boundaries for the project. She noted that the estimated timeline to complete the project is 15 months with an expected start date in August of 2025. She commented that before the start of construction, public outreach will be conducted and emphasized that staff consider other projects on nearby streets when scheduling work to avoid complete shutdowns or restricting streets at the same time. She confirmed that the amount requested for approval is for the entire project.
