1. Call meeting to order

Chair Marek called the meeting to order at 6:10 p.m.

2. Discuss and identify projects that can be completed by a Historic Preservation contractor.

Planning Director John Wesley explained the purpose of the meeting is to discuss projects that can be completed by a consultant. Mr. Wesley stated as they move forward with presenting to Council on hiring a full-time employee they want to point out a need for additional funding to help with special projects which a full-time employee would not be able to do.

There was discussion on several ideas of types of project they would want to use a consultant for. Those items were:

- Work with individual neon sign owners to help the preserve their sign and get the historic designation
- Develop possible locations and requirements to establish the neon sign park
- Prepare a national register nomination for the Federal Building
- Follow up with documentation of post WWII neighborhoods for either historic district or heritage neighborhood designation
- Prepare guidelines for rehab in established historic neighborhoods
- Revise and update our website
- 3. Discuss and review Historic Preservation Plan.
