### Informational Update on Recent Council Action:

At its January 24, 2022 meeting, the City Council acknowledged the receipt of the minutes of the November 16, 2021 Transportation Advisory Board meeting.

At its January 24, 2022 meeting, the City Council passed and adopted the following ordinance to implement the recommendations of the November 16, 2021 Transportation Advisory Board meeting. The respective ordinance will become effective 30 days after adoption.

### Speed Limits (40 mph & 35 mph): 10-4-4 & 10-4-5

Amending Sections 10-4-4 and 10-4-5 of the Mesa City Code to establish a speed limit of 40 mph on Warner Road from a point six hundred seventy-five feet (675') west of 80th Street to Ellsworth Road and a speed limit of 35 mph on Warner Road from Power Road to a point one thousand five hundred sixty feet (1,560') east of Power Road and from Ellsworth Road to Eastmark Parkway, as recommended by the Transportation Advisory Board.
