**In 200 words or less, please provide a brief description of the project submitted to the
12% SRPMIC Grant program.**

With the ever-increasing fast pace of life and the demands on time, people rush from place to place. To avoid heavily used major roads, particularly at rush hours from the downtown area, Mesa residents are observing more traffic and at higher speeds through their neighborhoods. Existing speed bumps aren't working, as noted by residents in the Wilbur, Evergreen and Fraser Fields historic districts. The older and often historic districts are voicing their concerns. These areas tend to be laid out in grid patterns, enabling faster speeds. A grant of \$3,000 would enable the study of older neighborhoods, including talking with residents. Data would be collected from a variety of sources and a plan of action created. The Transportation Department will then install data strips in several of the identified areas to collect current and specific data. Discussions would then ensue for installing effective calming features and seeking implementation funding for 2019. The end results from this grant would assist the city in moving forward with a program that would reduce speeds--and hopefully cars-- in the neighborhoods where residents expect more security and safety for their families, where children should be able to play safely in their yards.
