Chairman Raines excused Boardmember Castaneda from the meeting.

 Approval of the minutes of the Public Safety Local Fire and Police Pension Boards meeting of May 19, 2022.

It was moved by Boardmember Sheppard, seconded by Boardmember Russell, that the minutes of the Public Safety Local Fire and Police Pension Boards meeting of May 19, 2022 be approved.

### 2. Acknowledge receipt of PSPRS plan elections made by new hires.

It was moved by Boardmember Lentz, seconded by Boardmember Russell, that receipt of PSPRS plan elections made by new hires (**See Attachment 1**) be acknowledged.

### 3. Certification of full-time Law Enforcement Officers pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-842.24(A), 38-842.27, 38-842.31 and 38-847(D)1.

Subsequent to a review of all medical reports, Local Boardmembers requested the record reflect that applicants Noah Fraher, Elexus McGregor-Jones, Samuel Reeves, Andrew Stewart, and James Whiting have pre-existing medical conditions.

It was moved by Boardmember Russell, seconded by Boardmember Lentz, that Law Enforcement applicants Noah Fraher, Elexus McGregor-Jones, Samuel Reeves, Andrew Stewart, and James Whiting be certified subject to the pre-existing medical conditions as noted.

Upon tabulation of votes, it showed:

### 4. Discuss and take action on the rehire of PSPRS member John Santiago to Solid Waste Equipment Operator II.

Human Resources Director Teri Overbey stated that John Santiago retired effective 2/1/2022 and after competing in an open, competitive recruitment process, he was offered the non-PSPRS position of Solid Waste Equipment Operator II.

It was moved by Boardmember Lentz, seconded by Boardmember Russell, that the rehire of PSPRS member John Santiago to Solid Waste Equipment Operator II, effective 5/2/2022, be approved as within the statute requirements and that no alternate contribution will need to be paid.

Upon tabulation of votes, it showed:

### Discuss and take action on the Accidental Disability Retirement application of Police Officer Ryan Gallaugher.

Chairman Raines indicated that Police Officer Ryan Gallaugher was absent from the meeting. He stated that the members of the Local Board have reviewed Officer Gallaugher's application and medical records. He encouraged Boardmembers to pose any questions they may have regarding Officer Gallaugher's pending Accidental Disability Retirement application.

Boardmember Russell stated that the Local Board has reviewed the IME reports of Lisa Jones, M.D. and Glenn Clouse, Psy. D. He indicated that while Dr. Jones and Dr. Clouse disagree with each other regarding whether the condition totally and permanently prevents Officer Gallaugher from performing a reasonable range of duties, the Local Board must rely on Dr. Jones' evaluation to be in accordance with statute requirements. He noted that Dr. Jones is in agreement with the findings of Officer Gallaugher's attending physician, that Officer Gallaugher's condition was incurred in the performance of his duty, that his condition totally and permanently prevents him from performing a reasonable range of duties within his job classification, and that any conflicts in the medical evidence have been resolved by the Local Board.

It was moved by Boardmember Russell, seconded by Boardmember Lentz, that the Accidental Disability Retirement application of Police Officer Ryan Gallaugher be approved.

Upon tabulation of votes, it showed:

AYES – Brady-Lentz-Raines-Russell-Sheppard NAYS – None ABSENT – None

Carried unanimously.

## 6. Discuss and take action on the Accidental Disability Retirement application of Police Officer Justin Organ.

Chairman Raines welcomed Police Officer Justin Organ to the meeting. He stated that the members of the Local Board have reviewed Officer Organ's application and medical records. He encouraged the members to pose any questions they may have regarding Officer Organ's pending Accidental Disability Retirement application.

Boardmember Russell stated that the Local Board has reviewed the independent medical evaluations of Dr. Lisa Jones and Glenn Clouse. He indicated that both agree with the findings of Officer Organ's attending physician, that Officer Organ's condition was incurred in the performance of his duty, and that his condition totally and permanently prevents him from performing a reasonable range of duties within his job classification.

Chairman Raines indicated that in view of the absence of questions from the Board, he would entertain a motion relative to this case.

It was moved by Boardmember Lentz, seconded by Boardmember Russell, that the Accidental Disability Retirement application of Police Officer Justin Organ be approved.
